Staff and volunteers weeded invasive non-native plants; cultivated, nurtured, and planted native plants; hiked while also picking up trash; and lent a hand to the Earth in so many ways.

We worked hard and had fun while doing it.

We saved a new landscape, and added it to the Leomar Preserve, closing escrow on our new Paint Mountain property, and setting it up for success by developing a long-term strategy for its restoration.

Our education team continued to expand our outdoor programs, adding new Tribal partners, and implementing a successful Adventure Camp.

We completed the remodel of our office on the Mountain Meadow Preserve and moved in, creating a home for conservation in North County!






OPERATIONS ACHIEVEMENTS 2023

Our Administration and Operations Team works to build and maintain a steady foundation in all aspects of the Conservancy.

- Moved into Boulder Outlook, the Conservancy's new office at the Mountain Meadow Preserve.
- Completed another clean audit of Conservancy finances.
- Launched Connecting Conservation Corridors land preservation campaign to protect three key properties in Elfin Forest, Harmony Grove and San Elijo Hills.
- Resolved encroachment at Mountain Meadow Preserve, subsequently selling six acres to San Diego County Parks, consolidating ownerships.
- Hosted over 57 community events in the past two years.
- Conducted CPR and snake-handling training for all staff.









Creek OUTDOOR EDUCATION ACHIEVEMENTS 2023

Our Education Team works to introduce local youth and adults to nature.



- Supported 6 teachers and 435 students while raising Rainbow Trout in their classrooms and releasing them as part of the California Department of Fish and Wildlife's Trout in the Classroom program.
- Provided a 5-day outdoor adventure camp to 52 students attending schools throughout the Escondido Union School District over their summer break.
- Expanded educational programming by partnering with 2 new Tribal Partners, reaching 70 students with summer programming.
- Kicked off the update for a new 5-Year Strategic Plan for the Education Department.
- Funded and collaborated with Olivenhain Municipal Water District on the 16th Annual Amateur Photo Contest at the Elfin Forest Recreational Reserve.
- Held 4 Conservation Conversation lectures at the Elfin Forest Interpretive Center.
- Increased our collaboration with community partners through outreach events with the Environmental Education Leaders Network, SDG&E, San Diego Children's Discovery Museum, Coastal Roots Farm, and the Rincon Band of San Luiseño Indians.







LAND TEAM ACHIEVEMENTS 2023

Our Land Team works to preserve and restore the Escondido Creek watershed.

- △ Dedicated over 2,000 volunteer hours to land preservation.
- Closed escrow and successfully onboarded the 48.48-acre Paint Mountain (formerly White-Tate) property, protecting it forever.
- Increased management of gnatcatcher habitat in the inaugural year of the Gnatcatcher Fund.
- Volunteers and staff removed over 1,200 lbs of trash from Harmony Grove Road. Collaborated with Olivenhain Municipal Water District (OMWD), Palomar College, and California State University San Marcos to:
 - Survey more than 900 trees for Goldspotted Oak Borer, an invasive beetle destroying native trees in southern California.
 - Treat approximately 18 acres of oak woodlands, to help our iconic oaks fight the infestation.
- Discovered and protected two new populations of the threatened Orcutt's brodiaea plant on Keithley Preserve.


CONNECTING CONSERVATION CORRIDORS

People and wildlife need the same things — places to find food, safe shelter, a community to find a mate, and a peaceful life to raise their young. Habitat fragmentation due to development is one of the greatest threats to wildlife survival. This extensive loss of wildlife corridors threatens the survival of many species and increases wildlife conflicts with people and pets. That's where you come in!
